



Meeting called to order 7:00.

Attendance: Ted Inserra (President), Fran Antonelli (Vice President), Jane Kish (Treasurer), Shirlee Sandler (Secretary) were present. There were 38 attendees on the sign-in sheets.

Police Report: There were three crimes between 6/13 and 7/17/24. There was one auto theft, one theft from a vehicle, and one burglary.

Code Compliance: Senior Inspector Bernstein presented the Code Compliance Report. For the period 4/16-7/16/24, there were 65 cases: 1 complied, 15 closed, 13 no violation found, and 36 pending compliance. The most common violations were bulk trash, overgrowth & trash, driveway maintenance/parking on lawns, derelict vehicle, and public nuisance/general complaints.

Ted's Tidbits: Anthony's Coal Fired Pizza & Wings generously provided the food for our meeting.

Ric-Man Construction was fined \$178,000 for cutting down mangrove and gumbo limbo trees with a permit and dumping waste in the canal.

The speed humps on 12th Ave and 15th Ave have been delayed due to supply chain issues.

Ted is having discussions with the city regarding the permit for the mural on 20th St and Coconut Dr.
